1. Get lost in a book in the State Library of Victoria's domed reading room


This space is like something out of a movie. Norman G. Peebles, an architect from Bates, Peebles & Smart, designed the octagonal room, which opened in 1913. At the time it was one of the largest concrete domes in the world. The design was based on the British Museum in London and the Library of Congress in Washington.

2. Take a guided walking tour of the Australian Ballet Centre



3. Marvel at the Art Deco detail of the Manchester Unity building






The Forum Theatre received a revamp in 2017. Picture: Craig Hughes.

5. Rock to a gig at the gorgeously gothic Forum Theatre




